OPERATIONS BULLETIN 2013-02 May 31, 2013 Intoxilyzer 9000 Update

The final evaluations of the Georgia model Intoxilyzer 9000 have been completed by the GBI Crime Lab. This instrument has been selected to replace the Intoxilyzer 5000. All local and state law enforcement agencies in Georgia are approved to use the contract established with CMI for the purchase of the Intoxilyzer 9000. The base cost for the Intoxilyzer 9000 system including the gas delivery system, an external printer, and ISO17025 calibration is \$7998. The contract is posted on the DOFS website at <https://dofs.gbi.georgia.gov/downloads>. Consumable items are also listed on the contract at additional cost.
